SENATE.

Augusta, Jan. 31. Senate met according to adjournment and was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Hall of Augusta.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Fernald of Androscoggin-Bill, an act amending Section 49 of Chapter 42 of the Public Laws of the State of Maine to the United States 1899, relating to duties and powers of game wardens, which came from the House, referred to the committee on legal affairs, was laid on the table.

TAXATION.

By Mr. McFadden of Lincoln—Petition of William McKenney and 52 others, citizens of Westport, asking that Senate bill No. 4, taxing railroads on the value of their stock, be enacted into a law.

Also petition of W. A. Cochrane and 30 others, citizens of Edgecomb, for same.

Also petition of M. P. Milliken and 39 others, citizens of Richmond, for the same.

Also petition of Eben Chase and 34 others, citizens of Edgecomb, for the same.

ORDERS.

On motion by Mr. Burleigh of Aroostook,

Ordered, That the committee on taxation inquire into the expediency of taxing ice fields and stored ice and report by bill or otherwise.

Mr. BURLEIGH: I will say with reference to the foregoing order that the ice fields on our navigable rivers have become very valuable property, whether they are harvested or held for the purpose of influencing the market, without harvesting.

On motion of Mr. Plummer of Penobscot, bill, an act providing for the taxation of corporate franchises, was taken from the table and referred to the committee on taxation.

On motion of Mr. Fernald of Androscoggin, bill, an act to incorporate the Poland Telephone Co., was taken from the table and referred to the committee on railroads, telegraphs and expresses.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

Mr. Rankin, for the committee on financial affairs, to which was referred official bond of Oramandal Smith, State treasurer-elect, reported that they find the bond in due and legal form and the sureties good and sufficient, and recommend that the same be approved and the bond deposited with the secretary of State. The report was accepted and the bond approved.

Mr. Plummer, for the committee on legal affairs, to which was referred bill entitled an act to amend Chapter 60 of the Revised Statutes relating to divorce and annulling of marriages, reported that the same ought not to pass. Report accepted.

Mr. Burns, for the committee on mercantile affairs and insurance, to which was referred bill, entitled an act to amend sub-division 7 of Section 1 of Chapter 18 of the Laws of 1895, reported that the same ought not to pass. Report accepted.

Mr. Noble, for the committee on legal affairs, to which was referred bill, entitled an act amending the charter of the Rumford Falls municipal court, reported that the same ought to pass. Report accepted. Bill tabled for printing under joint rules.

Mr. Plummer, for the committee on legal affairs, to which was referred bill entitled an act to supply the town of Dexter with pure water, reported that the same ought to pass. Report accepted. Bill tabled for printing under the joint rules.

Mr. Stearns, for the committee on mercantile affairs and insurance, to which was referred bill, entitled an act to amend Chapter 16 of the Private and Special Laws of 1853, entitled an act to incorporate the North Yarmouth Mutual Fire Insurance Co., reported that same ought to pass. Report accepted. Bill tabled for printing under the joint rules.
