SENATE.

Thursday, Jan. 15th, 1903.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were presented, and referred:

Judiciary.

By Mr. Maddocks of Lincoln: Petition of the Squirrel Island Association for the incorporation of the Squirrel Island Village Corporation with bill accompanying.

Also, bill, an act to incorporate the Squirrel Island Village Corporation.

By Mr. Guernsey of Piscataquis: Bill, an act to amend chapter 262 of private and special laws of 1863 as amended by chapter 260 private and special laws of 1887 and chapter 54 private and special laws of 1899.

Legal Affairs.

By Mr. Clark of Hancock: Bill, an act to correct an error in chapter 79 of the public acts of 1899 and to amend section 2 of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

By Mr. Philbrook of Oxford: Bill, an act for regulating the use of gasoline and naphtha.

By Mr. Staples of Cumberland: Bill, an act to amend chapter 318 of the private and special laws of 1901 to consolidate the Bridgton & Harrison Electric Co. and the Bridgton Water Co.

Education.

By Mr. Wing of Androscoggin: Resolve in favor of Colby College.

Also statement of facts accompanying resolve in favor of Colby college.

Pensions.

By Mr. Morse of Waldo: Resolve in favor of Nellie E. Flanders of Liberty.

Oxford County Delegation.

By Mr. Philbrook of Oxford: Bill, an act to amend chapter 372 of the public laws of 1885 relating to the compensation of county commissioners of Oxford county.

Tabled for Printing, Pending Reference.

By Mr. Staples of Knox: Bill, an act to supply towns and cities with pure water.

Also: bill an act to establish a law uniform with other states relating to insurance policies.

Reports of Committees.

Mr. Wing of Androscoggin, for the committee on judiciary, to which was referred bill, entitled an act to amend chapter 143 of the Revised Statutes relating to insane persons, reported same in new draft under title of an act to amend chapter 143 of the Revised Statutes relating to insane persons, and that it ought to pass. The same was tabled for printing, under the joint rules.
