SENATE.

Friday, Jan. 16th, 1903.

Senate met according to adjournment, and was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Livingston of Augusta.

Journal read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

A communication was received from W. W. Stetson, State Superintendent of schools, with report in relation to permanent school fund accompanying same, and, on motion by Mr. Libby of Kennebec, the same was tabled for printing.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were presented and referred:

Judiciary.

By Mr. Goodwin of Somerset: Bill, An Act to amend Chapter 485 of the Private and Special Laws of 1901, establishing a municipal court in the town of Skowhegan.

Education,

By Mr. Dudley of Aroostook: Petition of John Waddell and 64 others of Mapleton in favor of Normal school in Aroostook county, same to be located at Presque Isle.

Also: Petition of W. H. Grendell and 40 others of Chapman Pl. in favor of Normal school in Aroostook county, same to be located at Presque Isle.

State Lands and State Roads.

By Mr. Libby of Kennebec: An Act to amend Chap. 285 of the Public Laws of 1901, entitled An Act providing for state roads and for the improvement thereof.

Inland Fisheries and Game.

By Mr. Staples of Cumberland: Resolve, for the purpose of operating the fish hatcheries and feeding stations for fish, and for the protection of fish.

Claims.

By Mr. Staples of Knox: Resolve in favor of Isaac Moore of Somersville, for reimbursement of three hundred dollars for money paid during Civil War of 1861.

Pensions.

By Mr. Guernsey of Piscataquis: Resolve in favor of Ebenezer O. Gerry. Public Charities and State Beneficiaries.

By Mr. Hyde of Sagadahoc: Resolve providing for an epidemic or emergency fund.

By Mr. Stetson of Penobscot: Resolve in favor of Bangor children's Home, with statement of facts.

Also: Petition trustees of the Bangor children's home, praying for an appropriation.

Temperance.

By Mr. Stetson of Penobscot: Petition of George K. Huntington and 36 others protesting against the resubmission of the prohibition law.

Taxation.

By Mr. Staples of Knox: Bill for taxation of stock held in corporations.

Orders.

By Mr. Stetson of Penobscot: Ordered, that the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game be authorized to visit such of the hatcheries and feeding stations as they deem expedient. The order received a passage.

By Mr. Wing of Androscoggin: Ordered, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet on Tuesday, January 20th, at 10 o'clock. The order received a passage.

On motion by Mr. Goodwin of Somerset, the vote whereby the foregoing order was passed, was reconsidered, and on motion by the same Senator the order was amended so as to read as follows: Ordered, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet on Tuesday, January 20th, thirty o'colck A. By Mr. Libby of Kennebec: Ordered, That the use of the Senate Chamber be granted to the Maine Press Association for its meetings on Wednesday evening, January 28, and Thursday after-

By Mr. Goodwin of Somerset: Ordered, That the Committee on Legal Affairs be directed to inquire into the expediency of passing an Act to pay back the License Fees, which the State has received under the Hawkers and Peddlers Act of 1901, said act having been pronounced unconstitutional by the Supreme Court. The order was passed.

By Mr. Goodwin of Somerset: Ordered, the House of Representatives concurring, that the joint select committee on the revision of the statutes be authorized to employ a clerk whose compensation shall be at the same rate as that of the Clerk to the Committee on the Judiciary. The order received a passage.

By Mr. Goodwin of Somerset: Ordered, the House of Representatives concurring, that the joint select mittee on the revision of the statutes to whom the report of the commissioner on the revision and consolidation of the public laws of the State, appointed under the resolve of March 21, 1901, has been referred, is hereby directed cause a final draft of the fifth revision of the public laws of the State to be prepared adopting such recommendations and suggestions contained in said report as seem proper and incorporating the legislation of the present session, and to present the same for enactment, at an adjourned session of the present Legislature; and to prepare and present such resolves as may be necessary for the printing and publication of such revision. The order received a passage.
