#### SENATE.

Wednesday, Feb. 25, 1903.

Senate met according to adjournment, and was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Quimby of Gardiner.

Journal of the previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

#### Read and Assigned.

An Act to prevent the pollution of the waters of Sebago Lake. On motion by Mr. Staples of Cumberland, this bill took its second reading, under suspension of the rules, and was passed to be engrossed.

An Act to legalize the doings of the town of Williamsburg.

An Act to repeal the provisions of Section 3 of Chapter 544 of the Special Laws of 1899, relating to the Bangor Street Railway.

An Act to extend the charter of the Ellsworth Street Railway Company.

An Act extending the charter and changing the name of the Van Buren Trust and Banking Company.

An Act to amend Section 129 of Chapter 47 of the Revised Statutes relating to officers and corporators of savings banks.

An Act to amend Chapter 215 of the Resolves of the State of Maine of 1897, relating to tuition of students in agriculture at University of Maine.

An Act in relation to the Hancock County Railway Company.

Resolve in favor of the town of Sanford.

An Act to amend Chapter 301 of the Private and Special Laws of 1850, entitled, "An Act to incorporate the Portland Widows' Wood Society, as amended by Chapter 145 of the Private and Special Laws of 1879.

An Act to authorize the county commissioners of Somerset county to borrow a sum of money with which to build an extension to the Court House at Skowhegan.

Bill, An Act relating to the salary of the Register of Probate for the county of Penobscot. This bill was passed to be engrossed in the Senate, then reconsidered, and amended, and passed to be engrossed as amended, and sent to the House. In the House, House amendment A was adopted, which was adopted by the Senate in concurrence. The bill as amended, was passed to be engrossed.

Bill, An Act to increase the salary of the county attorney of Oxford County. In the Senate, referred to the Oxford County Delegation. The House non. concurred in the reference, and referred the bill to the committee on salaries. On motion by Mr. Philbrook of Oxford, the bill was laid on the table.

Resolve in favor of Matthias Cullnan of Belfast, Maine. This resolve came back from the House, with a committee of conference joined on the part of the House, consisting of Messrs. Swett of Portland, Davis of Waterville and Libby of Mechanic Falls.

#### Orders.

On motion by Mr. Stetson of Penobscot, it was, Ordered: That a commission, consisting of five members of the present Legislature, be appointed by the Governor, to investigate the amount of salaries paid to the several State and county officials, whose salaries at the present time are determined by the Legislature.

Said commission is hereby given authority to summon witnesses, so as to obtain all necessary information, and are to report to the next Legislature, by bill or otherwise, a fair and reasonable compensation to be paid said officials with provisions that all fees pertaining to the several offices, be paid to the State or county treasurers as may be decided in each case.

Said commission to be paid a reasonable compensation for services and expenses, as may be decided by the next Legislature. On motion by Mr. Maddocks of Lincoln, it was, Ordered, that the use of the Senate Chamber be granted the Committee of Ways and Bridges to hold their meeting this day at three o'clock.

#### Report of Committees.

Mr. Morse, for the Committee on Pensions, on petition of Lewis C. Whitten and 66 others, praying that Cyrus Hurd of Carmel be granted a pension of eight dollars a month, reported that petitioner have leave to withdraw. Report accepted.

Mr. Guernsey, for the Committee on the Judiciary, on Bill, An Act to authorize the building of a dam at the outlet of Sebec Lake, reported same ought not to pass. Report accepted.

The same Senato,r for the same committee, on Bill, An Act to amend Chapter 180 of the Private Laws of 1866, entitled, An Act to incorporate the Sebec Dam Co., as amended by Section 6 of Chapter 26 of the Private and Special Laws of 1879, reported same in new draft, under same title, and that it ought to pass. Report accepted. Bill tabled for printing under the joint rules.

Mr. Wing, for the same committee on Bill, An Act to relieve the town of Boothbay Harbor from the duty of building, repairing and maintaining roads, streets and ways in the Isle of Springs, reported same in new draft, under same title, and that it ought to pass. Report accepted. Bill tabled for printing under the joint rules.

Mr. Clark, for the Committee on Legal Affairs, on Bill, An Act to amend the charter of the Bar Harbor Banking and Trust Company, reported same ought to pass. Report accepted. Bill tabled for printing under the joint rules.

The same Senator, for the same committee, on Bill, An Act to grant certain powers to the Hancock county trustees of public reservations, reported same ought to pass. Report accepted. Bill tabled for printing under the joint rules.

Mr. Wilson for the Committee on Education, Resolve in favor of Central Maine State Normal School at Dexter, reported that same be referred to the next Legislature. Report accepted.

At this point Mr. Gardner of Penobscot was called to the chair and presided.

On motion of Mr. Staples of Knox, bill, An Act to amend chapter 236 of the public laws of 1893 relating to the taking of lands or other property by railroads, was taken from the table. The pending question was the second reading of the bill. The bill took it's second reading, and was passed to be engrossed.

On motion of Mr. Goodwin of Somerset the Order relating to cost of State Government from 1880 to 1902 was taken from the table; and on further motion of the same senator, the order was passed. On motion of Mr. Pike of Washington,
