SENATE.

Monday, March 9, 1903.

Senate met according to adjournment, and was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Hayden of Augusta.

Journal of the previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

Bill, An Act to amend Section 2 of Chapter 93 of the Public Laws of 1899, fixing the salary of the county commissioners of Kennebec county. This bill came from the House having been reported by the Kennebec county delegation that it ought to pass. Report accepted in the House and by that branch referred to the committee on appropriations and financial affairs.

Mr. MANLEY of Kennebec: Mr. President, The reference of this bill by the House to the committee on appropriations and financial affairs is evidently a wrong reference, since the bill does not call for an appropriation to be paid from the State treasury. I move that the Senate non-concur in the reference, and that the bill be tabled for printing under the joint rules.

The motion prevailed, and the bill was tabled for printing under the joint rules.

An Act to authorize the navigation, by steam, of Eagle lake and the connecting lakes, in the county of Aroostook.

An Act to extend the charter of the Maine Water and Electric Power Company.

An Act to protect the waters of Lake Auburn.

Resolve in favor of the committee on revision of the Statutes.

An Act to construe and continue in force Chapter 106 of the Private and Special Laws of 1891, relating to the election of a school committee, and superintendent of schools, for the town of Skownegan.

An Act to amend Chapter 89 of the Public Laws of 1899, amendatory of Chapter 116 of the Public Laws of 1895, as amended by Chapter 286 of the Public Laws of 1897, and Chapter 206 of the Public Laws of 1901, entitled "An Act to provide for the schooling of children in unorganized townships. This bill came up for first reading.

Mr. GOODWIN of Somerset: Mr. President, I rise to suggest that there should be no consideration of this bill at the present time; and that it should be referred to the committee on appropriations and financial affairs, inasmuch as it carries an appropriation.

The bill was referred to the committee on appropriations and financial affairs.

An Act to extend the time during which the tolls granted to the Bangor Bridge Company shall continue.

An Act to incorporate the Hillside Water Company.

An Act to extend the charter of the Bluehill Trust and Banking Company.

An Act to incorporate the Wells Electric Light and Power Company.

On motion by Mr. Goodwin of Somerset, Bill, An Act to amend Chapter 42 of the Public Laws of 1899, relating to the taking of black bass in certain lakes of Kennebec and Somerset counties and also Sabattus pond in Androscoggin county as amended by Chapter 287, Public Laws of 1901, was laid on the table.
