## SENATE.

Friday, January 18, 1907.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Colby of Augusta. Journal of the previous session read and approved.

The following bills, petitions and resolves were presented and referred:

### Appropriations and Financial Affairs

By Mr. Hastings of Oxford: Resolve in favor of H. H. Hastings, Chairman of Committee on Senatorial Elections, in payment of witnesses', magistrates' and officers' fees and disbursements made by him in the election contest of senators in Kennebec County for Seventh Senatorial District.

By Mr. Simpson of York: Bill "An Act to provide in part for the expenditure of Government in the year of 1907.

By Mr. Eaton of Washington: Petition of M. N. McKusick and 16 others of Calais in favor of Temporary Home for Women and Children in Portland."

### Taxation.

By Mr. Clarke of Lincoln: Bill, An Act in relation to the taxation of mortgages on real estate."

### Temperance.

By Mr. Irving of Aroostook: Remonstrance of Frank P. Grant and 114 others of Fort Fairfield against Resubmission.

### Orders.

Ordered, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourned, that they adjourn to meet on Tuesday January 22, 1907, at 11.00 o'clock in the forenoon.

WHEREAS Wednesday, the 27th day of February, 1907, is the centennial anniversary of the birth of one of the most illustrious sons of Maine, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, a name held in affectionate memory by millions of old and young, both in this and other lands universally recognized as one of the greatest poets of any age or nation,

whose every written and spoken word was as beautiful as his life—a constant incentive to noble thought and lofty endeavor; and

WHEREAS a day which will be fittingly observed in thousands of schools and public bodies throughout the world, may with peculiar appropriateness be honored by the State of Maine at its capital city; therefore it was

ORDERED, the House concurring, that suitable public exercises be held in the hall of the House of Representatives on the evening of February 27, 1907, and that a joint committee of the Senate and House be named to make all necessary arrangements.

#### Reports of Committees.

Mr. Simpson for the committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs, on Resolve in favor of York Hospital, reported same in new draft under same title and that it ought to pass.

Mr. Eaton for the committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs on "Resolve in favor of Central Maine General Hospital" reported same in new draft under same title and that it ought to pass.

The same senator for the same committee on "Resolve in favor of Young Women's Home in Lewiston", reported that same ought to pass.

Mr. Hastings for the committee on Judiciary, on "Resolve in relation to York deeds", reported that same ought to pass.

Mr. Staples for the committee on Legal Affairs on "Bill An Act entitled "An Act authorizing the erection of a bridge or roadway across tide water between Mackworths Island in the town of Falmouth and the mainland in said town," reported that same ought to pass.

The foregoing reports were severally accepted, and the resolves and bill were tabled for printing under the joint rules.

Mr. Eaton for the committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs, on Resolve in favor of the Finance Committee, reported that same ought to pass. Report accepted.
