Saturday, April 3, 1909.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Kearney of Augusta.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

The committee on appropriations and financial affairs reported "ought to pass" on bill, An Act to appropriate money for the expenditures of government for the 1909.

The report was accepted and on motion by Mr. Hersey of Houlton the rules were suspended, the bill was read three times and was passed to be engrossed.

Same committee reported same on bill, An Act to appropriate money for the expenditures of government for the year 1910.

The report was accepted and on motion of Mr. Allen of Richmond the rules were suspended, the bill was read three times and was passed to be engrossed.

The following order was received from the Senate:

Ordered, That a committee of three on the part of the Senate, with such as the House may join, be appointed to wait upon the Governor and inform him that both branches of the Legislature, having acted upon all matters

before them, are now ready to receive any communication he may be pleased to make.

The order received a passage in concurrence.

The Speaker joined on the part of the House, Messrs. Burleigh of Augusta, Additon of Leeds, Allen of Richmond, Spear of South Portland, Bogue of East Machias, Lambert of Orono and Smith of Biddeford.

Subsequently Mr. Burleigh reported that the committee had attended to the duties assigned it, and the Governor would soon communicate with the House, through the secretary of State, and would transmit a list of the bills and resolves passed during the present session of the Legislature, and that he had no further communication to make.

Thereupon the secretary of State, Honorable Arthur I. Brown, came in and laid before the House the following communication:
