SENATE.

Wednesday, February 10, 1909. Senate called to order by the President

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Livingston of Augusta.

Journal of the previous session read and approved.

Mr. OSGOOD of Androscoggin: Mr. President: I desire to ask unanimous consent, by the courtesy of the Senate, to record my vote upon the measure which was enacted vesterday, relating to the uniform poll tax. I was, at the time the vote was taken, unavoidably absent, and detained. Had I been present, I should have voted for the amendment with the minority. I now ask unanimous consent that the Honorable Secretary may so record my vote as Yes.

By unanimous consent, the vote of Senator Osgood of Androscoggin was thereupon recorded in accordance with his request.

Ordered. That a committee of three be appointed by the Senate with as many as the House may join to ascertain by what authority the Governor and Council drew a warrant in favor of Newell & Skelton of Lewiston, Androscoggin county, State of Maine, for \$964.45 in case of E. W. Buckley against Maxime Bealieu and Ferd E. Stevens, May 28, 1908. and report by bill or otherwise, with full power to send for persons and papers.
