SENATE.

Monday, February 15, 1909. Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Gibson of Augusta.

Journal of the previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

Bill, "An Act to amend the charter of the city of Westbrook," came from the House, by that branch referred to the committee on judiciary. On motion by Mr. Wheeler of Cumberland this bill was tabled for printing, pending reference.

Bill, "An Act to provide for payment of expensess of county commissioners while attending their annual conventions," came from the House, by that branch referred to the committee on appropriations and financial affairs. On motion by Mr. Milliken of Aroostook the Senate voted to nonconcur in such reference; and on further motion by the same senator, the same was referred to the committee on salaries and fees.

Bill, "An Act to prevent judges and other officers from holding other offices," came from the House, by that branch referred to the committee on judiciary. On motion by Mr. Osgood of Androscoggin this bill was tabled for printing, pending reference.

Bill, "An Act to amend Specification 10 of Section 6 of Chapter 9 of the Revised Statutes, relating to the exemption from taxation of lands set apart for the production of forest trees, as amended by Chapter 169 of the Public Laws of 1907," came from the House, by that branch referred to the committee on forest preservation and water supply. On motion by Mr. Wheeler of Cumberland this bill was tabled for printing, pending reference.

The report of the committee on interior waters on Bill, "An Act to extend the rights, powers and privileges of the Milo Water Co.," that the same be referred to the committee on judiciary, came from the House by that branch accepted. On motion of Mr. Knowlton of Piscataquis the same was tabled.

Resolve for the purpose of operating the fish hatcheries and feeding stations for fish and for the protection of fish. On motion by Mr. Wyman of Washington, Senate Amendment A, to the foregoing Resolve was adopted as follows: "Senate Amendment A to Senate Document No. 167. In Senate, Feb. 15, 1909. Whereas, the fish hatcheries of the State now contain nearly 3,000,000 salmon and trout eggs and fish, which must have constant and careful attention from these in charge and,

Whereas, the men employed for this purpose are poor men with families, who must be paid monthly in order to retain their services, it becomes absolutely necessary that this Resolve should be passed so that the property of the State be not lost or endangered by the loss of the services of those men now on duty.

Whereas, In the opinion of the Legislature, the facts above stated create an emergency making it immediately necessary for the proper care and preservation of the property of the State, that the following resolve be passed so that the same may go into effect on approval." As amended the Bill was read and assigned.
