Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Hastings of Oxford, it was-Ordered, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet on Tuesday, March 2, at 10.30 o'clock in the forenoon.

This order was subsequently returned from the House, that branch concurring in its passage.

"An Act to renew and extend the charter of the Sebec Power Company." This bill having been passed to be engrossed in the Senate was by the House amended by House Amendment A, and as amended passed to be engrossed.

An Act to exempt certain public bonds from taxation. This bill was returned from the House, further amended by House Amendment B. On motion by Mr. Staples of Knox, the Senate voted to reconsider its vote whereby it passed the bill to be engrossed, as amended; and on his ford, the Senate voted to reconsider further motion pending the adoption of House Amendment B, the bill was tabled.
