#### HOUSE.

Monday, February 3rd, 1913.

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Quimby of Gardiner.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were presented and referred:

#### Judiciary.

By Mr. Peterson of New Sweden: An Act to incorporate the Stockholm Water Company. (Tabled for printing pending its reference to the committee on motion by Mr. Peterson.)

By Mr. Sanborn of South Portland: An Act to amend Section 38 of Chapter 47 of the Revised Statutes, relative to giving notice of the time and place of the sale of shares of stock in corporations to pay assessments.

By Mr. Kelleher of Portland: An Act to amend Chapter 256 of the Private and Special Laws of 1907. (Tabled for printing pending its reference to the committee on motion by Mr. Kelleher.)

By Mr. Sprague of Islesboro: Petition of George W. C. Drexel and 33 others, relative to prohibiting the use of automobiles in the town of Islesboro.

By Mr. Thombs of Lincoln: An Act to incorporate the Lincoln Light & Power Company.

#### Appropriations and Financial Affairs.

By Mr. Metcalf of Greenville: Resolve in favor of the Greenville Junction Young Men's Christian Association hospital, accompanied by statement of facts.

By Mr. Lawry of Fairfield: Resolve in aid of the Maine Anti-Tuberculosis Association, for educational and organization purposes.

#### Education.

By Mr. Morse of Rumford: An Act entitled "An Act to provide for instruction in thrift and economy in the public schools."

By Mr. Bowman of Vinalhaven: An Act to amend Sections 41, 42, 43 and 44 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, relating to the employment of superintendents of towns comprising school unions.

By Mr. Bass of Wilton: Petition of Adelaide L. Kiein and eight others of Wilton in favor of an Act to increase the efficiency of the public schools of Maine by retiring teachers of long service with pensions.

By Mr. Harriman of Cherryfield: Petition of M. J. Allen and 36 others of Cherryfield in favor of same.

By Mr. Elliot of Thomaston: Petition signed by E. L. Crawford and 14 others of Thomaston in favor of same.

By Mr. Bucklin of Warren: Petition of Clemmie Robbins and others of Union in favor of same; also petition of W. M. Teague and others in favor of same; also petition of W. K. Jordan and others in favor of same.

#### Ways and Bridges.

By Mr. Dresser of South Portland: An Act to provide for the reconstruction of Portland Bridge. (Tabled for printing pending its reference to the committee on motion by Mr. Sanborn of South Portland.)

#### Inland Fisheries and Game.

By Mr. Harman of Stonington: An Act for the protection of deer in the town of Isle au Haut, in the county of Hancock.

By Mr. Smith of Presque Isle: An Act to prohibit fishing in a portion of the Presque Isle Stream, Aroostook county, and in all its branches and tributaries, for a period of four years.

By Mr. Currier of Camden: Resolve in favor of the Canaan Lake Fish Screen Association of Camden, Maine, with statement of facts.

By Mr. Umphrey of Washburn: Remonstrance of L. E. Wilcox and 75 others, residents of the towns of Mapleton, Castle Hill and Chapman, against closing the Presque Isle Stream and its branches, in the county of Aroostook, to fishing for a period of four years.

By Mr. Bowler of Bethel: Petition of E. T. Stearns and 36 others for the screening of the outlet of Upper Kezar Lake in the town of Lovell.

By Mr. Marston of Skowhegan: Petition of J. C. Curtis and 95 others in favor of repealing an act to prohibit the use of gang hooks in inland waters.

By Mr. Smith of Presque Isle: Petition of Alex. Willett and 146 others of Presque Isle for a close time of four years on fishing in the Presque Isle Stream above Grindstone, and in the north and east branches of said stream and all brooks running into said stream.

By Mr. Marston of Skowhegan: Petition of B. W. Stinchfield and 48 others in favor of the repeal of the act to prohibit the use of gang hooks in inland waters.

By Mr. Harman of Stonington: An Act to amend Section 27 of Chapter 9 of the Revised Statutes, relating to the taxation of vessels. (Tabled for printing pending its reference to the committee by motion of Mr. Dunbar of Jonesport.)

#### Claims.

By Mr. Harriman of Cherryfield: Resolve in favor of the town of Milbridge, with statement of facts.

#### Salaries and Fees.

By Mr. Bucklin of Warren: An Act relating to compensation of register of deeds of Knox County.

#### Orders.

Ordered, that the use of the Hall of the House of Representatives be granted to the committee on School for the Feeble Minded for a hearing on the afternoon of February 6th, A. D., 1913.

On motion by Mr. Clark of Portland, it was

Ordered, that the committee on inland fisheries and game be directed to inquire into the expediency amending the law on deer in the counties of Androscoggin, Kennebec, Waldo, Knox, York, Lincoln, Cumberland, Sagadahoc and on the island of Mount Desert and on the islands within the limits of the town of Isle au Haut, ielands and in the towns and Swan's Island and on Cross and Scotch Islands, with a view to making a uniform close time on these places, and report by bill or otherwise.

#### Reports of Committees.

Mr. Wheeler from the committee on legal affairs, reported in a new draft and "ought to pass" on bill, An Act to create the Cherryfield Water District.

Mr. Scates from the committee on ways and bridges, reported "ought to pass" on bill, An Act to repeal Chapter 340 of the Public and Special Laws of 1907 relating to highway in Readfield closed to automobiles.

Mr. Umphrey from the same committee, reported in a new draft and "ought to pass" on resolve in favor of repairing bridges in the town of Dresden.

Same gentleman from same committee, reported in a new draft and "ought to pass' on resolve in favor of bridges in the town of Addison.

Mr. Gordon from the committee on claims, reported in a new draft and "ought to pass" on resolve in favor of C. R. Hall and George S. Lowell.

The reports were accepted and the several bills and resolves ordered printed under the joint rules.

Mr. Wheeler from the committee on legal affairs, on memorial by the town of Eden, reported legislation thereon inexpedient.

Mr. Hodsdon from the committee on taxation, reported "ought not to pass" on bill, An Act relating to certain exemptions for the purpose of giving local option in taxation.

Mr. Scates from the committee on ways and bridges, reported "ought not to pass" on resolve in aid of building bridge in Allagash Plantation.
