**SENATE**

Saturday, January 9, 1915.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. W. F. Livingston of Hallowell.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

The hour having arrived to which the joint convention adjourned, the Senate proceeded to the hall of the House.

On return of the Senate to their chamber

On motion by Mr. Boynton of Lincoln

Adjourned until Monday morning at 10 o'clock.

**HOUSE**

Saturday, January 9th, 1915.

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Stanley of Hallowell.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

At this point the Senate came in and a joint convention was formed.

**In Convention**

(President Hersey in the chair.)

Senator BOYNTON of Lincoln: Mr. Chairman, it being very evident that there is no quorum present, I move that this joint convention adjourn until next Monday morning at 10 o'clock.

The motion was agreed to.

The Senate thereupon retired to the Senate chamber.

**In The House**

On motion by Mr. Libby of Merrill, Adjourned until Monday morning next at 10 o'clock.
