HOUSE.

Tuesday, January 19, 1915.

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Burgess of Augusta.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were presented, and upon recommendation of the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

Appropriations and Financial Affairs.

By Mr. Haskell of Portland: Resolve in favor for Temporary Home for Women and Children, Portland.

By Mr. Sanborn of South Portland: Resolve in favor of S. R. Purinton.

Interior Waters.

By Mr. Gerrish of Greenville: Resolve in aid of navigation on Moosehead Lake.

Judiciary.

By Mr. Mullin of Lincolnville: Petition of A. L. Young and 13 others for repeal of law prohibiting automobiles on Turnpike Road in Camden and Lincolnville; also petition of J. H. Montgomery and 16 others for same.

Legal Affairs.

By Mr. Gerrish of Greenville: An Act to extend the charter of the Monson Water Company.

Taxation.

By Mr. Albert of Madawaska: Petition of E. R. Michaud of Frenchville and 14 others for an Act for the prompt payment of poll taxes.

Ways and Bridges.

By Mr. Albert of Madawaska: Petition of R. A. Daigle and 56 others for sum for International Bridge across St. John river opposite Edmundston, N. B.

Orders.

On motion by Mr. Higgins of Brewer, it was

Ordered, That the official reporter of the House be and hereby is authorized

to procure additional assistance in the preparation and completion of the Legislative Record at an expense not exceeding the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars.

On motion by Mr. Higgins of Brewer, it was

Ordered, That all Acts and Resolves appropriating moneys shall carry a statement of facts.

On motion by Mr. Greenleaf of Portland, it was

Ordered, The Senate concurring, that the time for the reception of petitions and bills for private and special legislation be limited to Wednesday, February 10th, 1915, and that all such petitions and bills presented after that day be referred to the next legislature, and that the Clerk of the House cause copies of this order to be published in all the daily papers in this State until February 1st, 1915.

On motion by Mr. Greenleaf of Portland, it was

Ordered, The Senate concurring, that no bill or resolve carrying an appropriation of money shall be introduced after the tenth day of February, 1915.

On motion of Mr. Greenleaf of Portland, it was

Ordered, That no bill or resolve carrying an appropriation of money shall be finally passed prior to the first day of March, 1915.

Orders of the Day.

From the Senate: Ordered, the House concurring, that a joint special committee consisting of three on the part of the Senate and seven on the part of the House be appointed to whom shall be referred all workmen's compensation acts and bills already presented or that may be presented during the present session of this legislature.

The order received a passage in concurrence.

The Speaker thereupon appointed as such committee on the part of the House Messrs. Clifford of Lewiston, Sanborn of South Portland, Descoteaux of Biddeford, Higgins of Brewer, Goodwin of Mexico, Connors of Bangor and Jordan of Baileyville.

From the Senate: Ordered, the House concurring, that a joint select committee to be designated "Committee on the Re-

vision of the Statutes' be appointed, consisting of three on the part of the Senate and seven on the part of the House.

The order received a passage in concurrence.
