## HOUSE

Thursclay, February 4th, 1915.
The House met according to athjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Hope of Adgusta.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Fapers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

From the Senate: An Act amendatory of Sections 27 and 28 of Chapter 129 of the Public Laws of 1913 , relating to corporations for the operation of telegraphs or telephones and other public utilities.
