The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Walch of Augusta.

Mr. MAHER of Augusta: Mr. Speaker, this Nation, its people and the lovers of freedom everywhere, having suffered a loss so distinct as to constitute a shock in the death of that man who typified the best there is in free government, that man

who personified virility and integrity, that man whose private life was a charm, and whose public record was an inspiration—the late Theodore Roosevelt, ex-President—that great American—I move that this House, as a slight token of tribuce, stand adjourned until tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock.

The motion was duly seconded.

The SPEAKER: A great American statesman, a brave soldier, and the father of brave soldiers, has answered the last call, and it is fitting at this time as a mark of respect that this House do stand adjourned until tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock.
