SENATE

Wednesday, January 12, 1921.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. C. O. Perry of Hallowell.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

The following bills were presented and on recommendation of the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

Legal Affairs

By Mr. Farrington of Kennebec: An Act to amend Section 24 of Chapter 67 of the Revised Statutes, relating to certification of copies of will by registers of probate or registers of deeds.

Salaries and Fees

By Mr. Sprague of Piscataquis: An Act to increase the clerk hire in the office of the clerk of courts of Piscataquis.

By the same Senator: An Act to amend Section 40 of Chapter 117 of the Revised Statutes, increasing the salary of the clerk of courts of Piscataquis County.

Orders

On motion by Mr. Baxter of Sagadahoc, it was

Ordered, that the Secretary of the Senate communicate with Hon. Taber D. Bailey of Bangor; Hon. Leon F. Higgins of Brewer; Luere B. Deasy of Bar Harbor; Ira G. HERSHEY of Houlton; and Carl E. Milliken of Island Falls, requesting that their portraits be sent so that the same may be framed and placed in the office of the Senate.

That the secretary is further directed to communicate with Mrs. Nathan Clifford of Cape Elizabeth, requesting her to send the portrait of the late Hon. Nathan Clifford, so that the same may be suitably framed and placed in the office of the President of the Senate.

Reports of Committees

Mr. Thombs of the joint select com-

mittee on Governor's Message to which was referred the inaugural address of the Governor, reported that they have had the same under consideration and asked leave to report as follows:

That so much thereof as relates to the hydro-electric situation be referred to the committee on judiciary;

That so much as relates to the problem of railroad operation resulting from the disruptive management during the Federal control, and taxation, be referred to the committee on taxation;

That so much as relates to agriculture be referred to the committee on agriculture;

That so much as relates to roads be referred to the committee on ways and bridges;

That so much as relates to labor and unemployment be referred to the committee on labor;

That so much as relates to fisheries be referred to the committee on sea and shore fisheries;

That so much as relates to schools and education be referred to the committee on education;

That so much as relates to the National Guard of the State be referred to the committee on military affairs;

That so much as relates to salaries be referred to the committee on salaries;

That so much as relates to the State budget be referred to the committee on Appropriations and financial affairs, with power to act or otherwise.

The report was accepted and sent down for concurrence.

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Hall of Franklin the report of the State Auditor was taken from the table, and on further motion by the same senator the report was then referred to the committee on appropriations and financial affairs.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Clark of Lincoln, adjourned until tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock.
