SENATE

Thursday, January 20, 1921

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. C. H. Young of Hallowell.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were received and upon recommendation of the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

Claims

By Mr. Gurney of Cumberland: Resolve in favor of the Emery-Waterhouse Company of Portland, Maine for material furnished for the construction of the Central School Building for the State School for Girls at Hallowell.

By Mr. Thombs of Penobscot: Resolve in favor of Manzie I. Rogers for building highways in the towns of Searsport and Dover.

Judiciary

By Mr. Morison of Penobscot: Resolve in favor of Austin W. Jones Company, of Veazie, Maine, reimbursing for property destroyed by fire. (300 ordered printed.)

Legal Affairs

By Mr. Sprague of Piscataquis: An Act to amend Section 16, Chapter 20, of the Revised Statutes relating to the inspection of records of poisons sold by druggists.

By Mr. Garcelon of Androscoggin: An Act to authorize Counties, Cities and Towns, and Municipal Public Service Corporations to pension employees after long and honorable service. (500 ordered printed.)

Library

By Mr. Sprague of Piscataquis: Resolve in favor of the State purchasing the alphabetical index of Revolutionary Pensioners in Maine.

Salaries and Fees

By Mr. Hall of Franklin: An Act

to increase the salaries of the Clerks of Courts of Androscoggin, Franklin, Hancock, Kennebec, Knox, Lincoln, Penobscot, Washington and York Counties. (300 ordered printed.)

Taxation

By Mr. Garcelon of Androscoggin: An Act to amend paragraph nine of section six of chapter ten of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter 105 of the Public Laws of 1919, relating to exemption from taxation of the estates of soldiers and sailors. (500 ordered printed.)

Ways and Bridges

By Mr. Clark of Lincoln: Resolve in favor of Wiscasset-Edgecomb Bridge.

By Mr. Babb of Cumberland: Resolve for repairing a road in the town of Sebago.

By Mr. Thombs of Penobscot: Resolve in favor of road in town of Prentiss.

By Mr. Hall of Franklin: Resolve in favor of Washington Plantation in Franklin County for repairing road.

Orders

On motion by Mr. Thombs of Penobscot, it was

Ordered, that the use of the Senate Chamber be extended to the joint committees on legal affairs and labor on Tuesday afternoon and evening, February 8, 1921.

On motion by Mr. Emerson of Aroostock, it was

Ordered the House concurring, that the State land agent and the forest commissioner be directed to prepare a map of the proposed Mount Katahdin State Park, and that 200 copies or blue prints thereof be made for the use of the Legislature.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Gillin of Penobscot, it was

Ordered, the House concurring, that the time for the reception of petitions and bills for private and special legislation be limited to Thursday, February 10, 1921, at 4 o'clock P. M., and that all such petitions and bills presented after that date be referred to the next Legislature; that

the secretary of the Senate cause copies of this order to be published in all the daily and weekly papers of the State until and including February 9, 1921.

Sent down for concurrence.

Reports of Committees

Mr. GILLIN from the Committee on Judiciary, on An Act to regulate cold storage of certain articles of food, reported and asked that three hundred copies of the same be printed and that the bill be recommitted to the Committee on Judiciary.

The report was accepted and the bill tabled for printing pending return to the same committee.

Mr. PARENT from the Committee on Legal Affairs, on An Act to amend Section twenty-four, Chapter sixty-seven of the Revised Statutes relating to certification of copies of wills by Registers of Probate to Registers of Deeds, reported same ought to pass.

The report was accepted and the bill tabled for printing under the joint rules.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair would suggest to the senator from Penobscot, Senator Gillin, that the bill in relation to the board of State assessors, tabled by him for printing, has been returned to the Senate.

On motion by Mr. Gillin of Penobscot An Act to amend Sections 12 and 15 of Chapter 9 of the Revised Statutes, relating to the board of State assessors, was taken from the table.

On further motion by the same senator the bill was then referred to the committee on salaries and fees in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Holt of Hancock, Adjourned until tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock.
