Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

From the House: Resolve providing a teacher's pension for Josie B. Paine.

In the House this bill was referred to the committee on pensions.

On motion by Mr. Allen of York the Senate non-concurred in the reference, and on further motion by the same senator the bill was referred to the committee on education.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were received and on recommendation of the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

Inland Fisheries and Game

By Mr. Clement of Waldo: An Act to amend Section 46 of Chapter 33 of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter 219 of the Public Laws of 1917, and Chapter 133 of the Public Laws of 1919 relating to protection of fur-bearing animals.

Judiciary

By Mr. Gurney of Cumberland: An Act to validate the incorporation of Libby, McNeil and Libby and to amend its corporate purposes.

By Mr. Baxter of Sagadahoc: An Act to ratify, confirm and make valid the doings of the Old Folks' Home in Bath, and the Home for Aged Couples and Old Men in consolidating the

Homes for the Aged maintained by them severally.

By Mr. Thompson of Knox: An Act to repeal Sections 1 and 3 of the Public Laws of 1917 relating to the foreclosure of mortgages on real estate. (300 ordered printed).

Library

By Mr. Spencer of York: Resolve to appropriate money for the purchase of a history of York.

Pensions

By Mr. Clement of Waldo: Resolve providing a State pension for Mrs. Jessie Bacon.

Salaries and Fees

By Mr. Gurney of Cumberland: An Act to amend Section 40 of Chapter 117 of the Revised Statutes of Maine in relation to compensation of clerks of courts, and Section 45 of Chapter 117 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, in relation to clerk hire in county offices.

By Mr. Eaton of Oxford: An Act to increase the amount of money allowed for clerk hire in the office of the clerk of courts in Oxford county.

By Mr. Allen of York: An Act to amend Section 20 of Chapter 117 of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter 179 of the Public Laws of 1917, and by Chapter 147 of the Public Laws of 1919, relating to the salary of the State superintendent of public schools.

By Mr. Eaton of Oxford: An Act to increase salary of clerk of courts in Oxford county.

Ways and Bridges

By Mr. Adams of Kennebec: Resolve to aid in the repair and improvement of the "Narrows Road" in the towns of Mount Vernon, Rome and Belgrade.

Bills in First Reading

An Act to amend Section 24 of Chapter 67 of the Revised Statutes, relating to the certification of copies of wills by registers of probate to registers of deeds.
