Tuesday, January 25, 1921.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. J. P. Irving of Gardiner.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

From the House: An Act to amend Chapter 50 of the Revised Statutes as amended by Section 9, Chapter 238 of the Public Laws of 1919, relating to the workmens' compensation.

In the House this bill was referred to the committee on judiciary, in concurrence. Subsequently the House reconsidered its vote and then referred the bill to the joint committees of judiciary and labor.

Salaries and Fees

By Mr. Gillen of Penobscot: An Act pertaining to judges of probate. (300 copies ordered printed.)

Ways and Bridges

By Mr. Sprague of Piscataquis: Resolve in aid of navigation on Sebec Lake in Piscataquis County.

Passed to be Engrossed

Resolve, entitled "An Act to amend Section 24 of Chapter 67 of the Revised Statutes, relating to the certification of copies of wills by registers of probate to registers of deeds.

Mr. BAXTER of Cumberland: Mr. President, I move that the rules be suspended in order that I may introduce out of order, An Act establishing the Mount Katahdin State Park.
