SENATE

Thursday, January 11, 1923 Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. M. G. Folsom of Gardiner.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

On motion by Mr. Phillips of Hancock, (under suspension of the rules) it was

Ordered, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn they adjourn to meet Tuesday. January 16, at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Eaton of Oxford, the rules were suspended and that senator presented out of order the bond of William L. Bonney as State Treasurer, and on further motion by the same senator the bond was referred to the committee on appropriations and financial affairs.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

From the House: Ordered, the Senate concurring, that a committee be appointed consisting of three on the part of the House with such as the Senate may join, to make a contract for the purchase of a picture of the late Governor Parkhurst to be hung in the State House, the price of same to be charged to legislative expense.

In the House this order was passed but the committee was not appointed.

In the Senate the Chair appointed as such committee on the part of the Senate Messrs. Buzzell of Waldo, Bailey of Penobscot, Morneau of Androscoggin.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair at this time will announce the Senate members on the House order relating to the Maine Publicity Committee, the members on the part of the House have not as yet been handed

to the Chair; the senator from Washington, Mr. Emery, the senator from Kennebec, Mr. Wadsworth, and the senator from Cumberland, Mr. Brewster.

ORDERS

On motion by Mr. Putnam of Washington, it was

Ordered, that one hundred copies of the Journal of the Senate of the present session be printed and bound under the supervision of the Secretary of the Senate, and that the State Librarian be directed to furnish one copy of said Journal to each member and officer of the Senate, the balance to be deposited in the State Library for exchange purposes.

On motion by Mr. Kirschner of Androscoggin, it was

Ordered, the House concurring, that the Secretary of the State be directed to furnish to clerks of committees, postage stamps and such other necessities for the transaction of their business as said committee shall order.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Ryder of Piscataquis, it was

Ordered, that the Secretary of State be directed to furnish a copy of the Maine State Year Book, to each member and officer of the Senate.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair feels it is not out of place to say at this time that the earlier the committees are organized and get to work, of course the earlier we can get at the actual business of the session, and I hope it is not out of place for me to ask that committees organize as soon as possible so that we may get down to business.

On motion by Mr. Kirschner of Androscoggin,

Adjourned until Tuesday, January 16. at 4.30 o'clock.
