# SENATE

Monday, January 22, 1923.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. S. B. Purves of Augusta.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were received and on recommendation by the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

#### Judiciary

On motion by Mr. Wadsworth of Kennebec: An Act providing for a tax upon gasoline and other products used in propelling motor vehicles. (1000 copies ordered printed.)

By Mr. Clark of Lincoln: An Act tc amend Section 3 of Chapter 120 of the Revised Statutes, relating to carelessly shooting human beings while engaged in hunting.

#### Legal Affairs

By Mr. Brewster of Cumberland: An Act providing for a jewelers' lien. (500 copies ordered printed.)

By the same senator: Resolve proposing an amendment to the Constitution authorizing the regulation of advertising signs in public view. (Tabled pending reference on motion by Mr. Wadsworth of Kennebec.)

### Pensions

By Mr. Morneau of Androscoggin:

Resolve in favor of Cornelius Linnehan for State pension.

## Orders of the Day

The PRESIDENT: The Chair will suggest that it is expected there will be some papers from the House, and the Senate may be at ease for a few moments.

Senate called to order by the President.

From the House: Report of the committee on appropriation and financial affairs, on Resolve appropriating money for the University of Maine for fire escapes, reporting same in a new draft under the same title and that it ought to pass.

In the House the report of the committee was accepted, and under suspension of the rules the bill was read twice and passed to be engrossed.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Allen of York, the report was temporarily tabled.

Subsequently, on motion by the same senator, the report was taken from the table, and under suspension of the rules the report of the committee was accepted, the bill was given its two readings and was passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.
