Tuesday, January 30, 1923.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. C. H. Atkins of Gardiner.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were presented and on recommendation by the committee on reference of bills, were referred to the following committees:

Appropriations and Financial Affairs

By Mr. Eaton of Oxford: An Act to amend Chapter 3, Section 31, of the Revised Statutes, relative to printing and binding of reports of certain departments.

Education

By Mr. Wadsworth of Kennebec: Resolve in favor of Monmouth Academy to meet deficit in maintenance of Monmouth Academy.

Salaries and Fees

By Mr. Putnam of Washington: An Act to amend Section 2, Chapter 118,

Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter 125, Public Laws of 1921, relating to fees of trial justices.

Taxation

By Mr. Eaton of Oxford: An Act to amend Section 44 and 45 of Chapter 10, Revised Statutes, relating to taxes in unincorporated places. (500 copies ordered printed).

By the same senator: An Act to amend Sections 63 and 64 of Chapter 8, Revised Statutes, relative to Maine forestry district taxes. (500 copies ordered printed).

Ordered, that the American Flag be displayed at the desk of the President during all sessions of the 51st Legislature.
