Appropriations and Financial Affairs

By Mr. Hussey of Aroostook, Resolve, in favor of the Secretary of the Senate of the Eighty-first Legislature, for services at the organization of the Eighty-second Legislature.

Claims

By Mr. Clarke of Hancock, Re-olve in favor of H. H. Havey and Bradbury Smith to reimburse them for loss under highway construction contract.

Inland Fisheries and Game

By Mr. Buzzell of Oxford, An Act closing Lovewell's Pond in the town of Fryeburg and County of Oxford to all fishing therein between the first day of January and the 30th day of June, both inclusive, of each year.

Interior Waters

By Mr. Bond of Lincoln, An Act to change the name of Pleasant Pond, in the towns of Whitefield and Jefferson, to Clary Lake.

By the same Senator, Petition of Leslie Boynton of Jefferson and others in favor of the same.

Judiciary

By Mr. Carter of Androscoggin, An Act making uniform the registration of married women as voters. (500 copies ordered printed.)
