SENATE

Tuesday, Jan. 27, 1925

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. A. F. Leigh of Randolph.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

From the House: Ordered, the House concurring, that the time for the reception of bills for private and special legislation be limited to Thursday, Feb. 12, 1925, at four o'clock P M. and that all such petitions and bills presented after that date be referred to the next legislature; that the Secretary of the Senate cause copies of this order to be published in all the daily and weekly papers of the State until and including Wednesday, Feb. 11, 1925.

This order was read and passed in the Senate Jan. 21. It comes back from the House, House Amendment "A" adopted, and the order given a passage as amended by House Amendment "A." On motion by Mr. Hinckley of

On motion by Mr. Hinckley of Cumberland, House Amendment "A" was adopted, and the order as amended was passed in concurrence with the House.

On motion by Mr. Hinckley of Cumberland, (out of order) it was

Ordered, the House concurring, that a special committee of five members, two from the Senate and three from the House of Representatives, be appointed to act in conjunction with a committee of two from the Covernor's Council to be appointed by the Governor, for the purpose of investigating the proposed locations of a bridge over the Kennebec River in the vicinity of Bath and Woolwich, said committee to make such investigation at the earliest possible time and to report forthwith to the Legislature.

Sent down for concurrence.
