Wednesday, January 28, 1925.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. R. W. D. Smith of Hallowell.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were received and on recommendation by the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

Appropriations and Financial Affairs

By Mr. Chalmers of Penobscot, Resolve, in favor of the Bangor State Hospital for maintenance and other purposes. (S. P. 47).

(Tabled by Mr. Chalmers of Penobscot, pending reference to a committee).

By the same Senator, Resolve, in favor of the Bangor State Hospital for new construction and permanent improvements. (S. P. 48).

(Tabled by Mr. Chalmers of Penobscot, pending reference to a committee).

Taxation

By Mr. Wadsworth of Kennebec,

Resolve, providing for a Commission to investigate and make report to the Governor and Council to be transmitted to the Legislature not later than February 1, 1927 relative to the necessity or advisability of changing the existing method of taxing railroads and railroad corporations operating in the State of Maine. (S. P. 49).

(Tabled by Mr. Allen of York, pending reference to a committee).

House Bills in First Reading

Resolve, Appropriating Money for the Expenses of the Electoral College for the State of Maine for the year 1925. (H. P. 13).

This resolve was read twice, under suspension of the rules, and passed to be engrossed in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Powers of Aroostook, H. P. No. 7, An Act in relation to standard time, was taken from the table, and on further motion by the same Senator the matter was referred to the committee on commerce in concurrence with the House.
