SENATE

Tuesday, February 3, 1925.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Stuart B. Purves of Augusta.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

From the House: An Act providing for a yearly limit of one deer in all counties of the State. (H. P. 258) (H. D. 51).

In the House this was referred to the committee on inland fisheries and game.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Powers of Aroostook, tabled, pending reference in concurrence.

From the House: An Act to create a closed season on bear, to repeal the provision of law as to bounties on the same, and to amend certain sections of the laws relating to bear. (H. P. 257) (H. D. 52).

In the House this was referred to the committee on inland fisheries and game.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Morrison of Franklin, tabled, pending reference in concurrence.

Ordered, that the use of the Senate Chamber be given to the Committee on Commerce for the

afternoon of Wednesday, February 11, for a hearing on the Daylight Saving bill, commencing at two o'clock.

Committee Reports

The Committee on Legal Affairs, on bill "An Act to incorporate the city of Brewer High School District," (H. P. 17) (H. D. 8), reported that the same ought to pass.

The report was read and accepted and on motion by Mr. Hinckley of Cumberland, the rules were suspended, the bill given its two several readings and passed to be engrossed in concurrence.

Finally Passed

Resolve, Appropriating Money for the Expenses of the Electoral College for the State of Maine for the Year Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-five.

Resolve, in Favor of the Secretary of the Senate of the Eighty-first Legislature, for Services at the Organization of the Eighty-second Legislature.

Resolve, in Favor of George H. Chick.
