HOUSE

Wednesday, January 26, 1927. The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Greenman of Augusta.

Journal of the previous session read and approved.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

From the Senate: Bill an act to amend Chapter 148 of the Revised Statutes, creating a field agent for the blind, and guide for defining the duties and compensation of such field agent and guide, in the Eightysecond Legislature referred to this Legislature. (S. P. 4, 1925)

In the Senate referred the Committee on Pensions.

In the House, on motion by Mr.

Bissett of Portland, tabled pending reference for concurrence.

From the Senate: Bill an act to regulate fishing in the Silver Lakes, so called, in Manchester, Sidney and Belgrade. (C. P. 24)

On motion by Mr. Blaisdell of Franklin, it was voted to take from the table House Paper No. 25, an act granting Charles H. Scott the right to maintain a ferry across Eggemoggin Reach in Hancock County.

Mr. BLAISDELL: Mr. Speaker, I yield to Mr. Patterson of Castine. Mr. PATTER3ON: Mr. Speaker, I ask leave at this time to withdraw this bill granting a franchise to Charles H. Scott of Deer Isle the right to maintain a ferry across Eggemoggin Reacn. The reason of this is that a bill is going in in a few days in a new draft, covering the same subject.

Thereupon leave was granted to withdraw the bill.

On motion by Mr. Pounds of Portland it was voted to take from the table House Paper No. 16, an act relative to the Portland Terminal Company; and on further motion by the same gentleman the bill was referred to the committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Mr. Williams of Webster, it was voted to take from the table the resolve in favor of the town of Leeds, tabled by that gentleman this morning; and on further motion by the same gentleman the resolve was referred to the committee on claims.

On motion by Mr. Sturgis of Leeds Adjourned until ten o'clock tomorrow morning.
