Tuesday, February 8, 1927.

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

On motion by Mr. Cyr of Waterville, by unanimous consent the House voted to defer the reading of the Journal of the previous session until tomorrow morning.

Unanimous consent was given Mr. Cyr of Waterville to present the following resolution out of order:

WHEREAS the House of Representatives of the Eighty-Third Legislature of Maine has learned with profound sorrow of the untimely death on the morning of February fifth of an esteemed colleague, Sherman L. Berry, representative from Waterville:

AND WHEREAS each member of

the House senses a personal loss and a genuine grief at the passing of him who was in the midst of greatest usefulness to his State:

NOW BE IT RESOLVED that the State of Maine has added to the laurel scroll of its honored dead the name of a native son whose battles of life were fairly fought, whose victories were modestly enjoyed, and whose passing leaves a memory to be cherished as a testimonial to a life of kindness, uprightness, and encouragement.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLV-ED that a copy of these resolutions be sent to the bereaved family of the late gentleman from Waterville.

Thereupon the resolutions were adopted by a unanimous rising vote.

MR. CYR: As a further mark of respect, Mr. Speaker, I now move that the House adjourn for the day.
