SENATE

Wednesday, January 16, 1929

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Carl N. Garland, of Augusta.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

From the House: The following order,

Ordered, the Senate concurring, that the Joint Standing Committee for this session on Inland Fisheries and Game be authorized to attend the New England Sportsmen's Show now being held in Mechanics Building in Boston, Mass.

In the House: read and passed.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Greenleaf of Androscoggin tabled pending concurrent action.

From the House: Resolve in favor of St. Joseph's Orphanage (Girls Orphanage). (H. P. 12)

In the House, referred to the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs.

In the Senate, on motion by Mrs. Pinkham of Aroostook, tabled pending reference.

The following bills were received and on recommendation by the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

Legal Affairs

Mr. DWINAL of Knox: An Act authorizing and legalizing copies of certain volumes of records of deeds in Knox County. (S. P. 9)

Sent down for concurrence.

Pensions

Mr. OAKES of Cumberland: An Act to amend the statutes relating to pensions of the blind. (S. P. 10) (500 copies ordered printed.)

Sent down for concurrence.

Salaries and Fees

Mr. DWINAL of Knox: An Act relating to clerk hire in the office of Register of Deeds for Knox County. (S. P. 11)

The same Senator: An Act relating to clerk hire in the office of Clerk of Courts for Knox County. (S. P. 12)

Sent down for concurrence.

Reports of Committees

Mr. Martin, from the Special Joint Committee on telephone service for the Legislature, to which was referred the order relating to telephone service, reported the following order, and that it ought to pass.

Ordered, the House concurring, that free telephone service be provided for each member of the Senate and House to the number of fifty (50) calls, of reasonable duration, from Augusta to points within the limits of the State of Maine, and that each member of the Senate and House be provided with a card to be certified to by the Secretary of State or his Deputy; the cost of this service to be paid to the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company at regular tariff rates.

The report was accepted, and the order read and passed.

Sent down for concurrence.

Adjourned until tomorrow morning at ten o'clock.
