**SENATE**

Thursday, January 17, 1929

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. A. W. Brown of Gardiner.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

On motion by Mrs. Pinkham of Aroostook, out of order and under suspension of the rules, it was

Ordered, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet Tuesday, January 22, at four-thirty o'clock in the afternoon.

Sent down for concurrence.

Subsequently the foregoing order came back from the House read and passed in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Greenleaf of Androscoggin, out of order and under suspension of the rules, it was

Ordered, the House concurring, that the Senate and House Chairman of the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game, and the Senate and House Chairman of the Committee on State Lands and Forest Preservation, with one House member of each of these Committees, said House members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House, be authorized to attend the meeting of the New England Sportsmen's Association, at Mechanics Building, Boston, Mass., at an expense not to exceed two hundred dollars.

Sent down for concurrence.

Subsequently the foregoing order came back from the House, read and passed in concurrence.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Mitchell of Aroostook the rules were suspended, the resolve was given its second reading and passed to be engrossed.

#### Orders of the Day

On motion by Mrs. Pinkham of Aroostook the Senate voted to take from the table Resolve in favor of St. Joseph's Orphanage, (Girls Orphanage), (H. P. 12) tabled yesterday by that senator pending reference and on further motion by the same senator the resolve was referred to the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Greenleaf of Androscoggin the Senate voted to take from the table the order with reference to authorizing the attendance at the New England Sportsmen's Show in Boston of the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game, tabled by that senator yesterday; and on further motion by the same senator the order was indefinitely postponed.

On motion by Mr. Weatherbee of Penobscot the Senate voted to take from the table the communication from the Department of State transmitting the report of the Commissioner on the revision and consolidation of the public laws of the state of Maine, tabled by that senator on January 15th; and on further motion by the same senator the communication was referred to the Joint Select Committee on Revision of the Statutes.
