Tuesday, January 22, 1929

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Fāna L. Knowlton of Augusta.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

The following bills, resolves, petitions, etc., were received and on recommendation by the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

Agriculture

Mr. Slocum of Cumberland: An Act relating to the sale of milk, cream, jars and bottles. (S. P. 19)

Mrs. Allen of Penobscot: Resolve in favor of Highmoor Farm, in the town of Monmouth. (S. P. 20)

The same Senator: Resolve in favor of animal husbandry. (S. P. 21)

The same Senator: Resolve making appropriation for the support and maintenance of the Maine Agricultural Experiment Station. (S. P. 22)

The same Senator: Resolve in favor of scientific investigation in agriculture in Aroostook County. (S. P. 23)

The same Senator: Resolve to appropriate money for cooperative agricultural work between the College of Agriculture of the University of Maine and the United States Department of Agriculture. (S. P. 24)

On motion by Mr. Slocum of Cumberland, the Senate voted to take from the table Resolve providing for erection of equestrian statue at Gettysburg in memory of Maj. Gen. Oliver Otis Howard (H. D. 9) tabled by that senator on January 17th pending reference, and on further motion by the same senator the resolve was referred to the Committee on Military Affairs, in non-concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Greenleaf of Androscoggn, the Senate voted to take from the table Special Report of the Directors of the Old Age Survey, tabled by that senator on January 3rd pending reference, and on further motion by the same senator the report was referred to the Committee on Pensions.
