Wednesday, January 23, 1929.
Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. R. H. Moyle of Hallowell.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

The following bills, resolves, etc., were received and on recommendation by the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

Aeronautics and Radio Control

Mr. Spear of Cumberland: An Act concerning the licensing of air-men and aircraft, concerning air traffic rules, and to make uniform the law with reference thereto. (S. P. 31)

Appropriations and Financial Affairs

Mr. Greenleaf of Androscoggin: Resolve in favor of Central Maine General Hospital, Lewiston, Maine. (S. P. 32)

Mr. Mitchell of Aroostook: Resolve in favor of Philip T. Carroll. (S. P. 33)

Sent down for concurrence.

Banks and Banking

Mr. Oakes of Cumberland: An Act to incorporate the "New England Public Finance Co." (S. P. 34)

Education

Mr. Wheeler of Oxford: Resolve in favor of Fryeburg Academy. (S. P. 35)

Inland Fisheries and Game

Mr. Nickerson of Waldo: An Act to close Toddy Pond to white perch fishing. (S. P. 36)

Insane Hospitals

Mr. Mitchell of Aroostook: Resolve in favor of Augusta State Hospital. (S. P. 37)

The same Senator: Resolve in favor of Augusta State Hospital for new construction. (S. P. 38) (500 copies of each ordered printed) Sent down for concurrence.

Judiciary

Mr. Mitchell of Aroostook: Petition of H. P. Kalloch and 19 others (S. P. 39); petition of Marc O. Boose and 35 others in favor of bill "An Act to register and license barbers and create a Board of Barber Examiners" (S. P. 40).

Pensions

Mrs. Carter of Androscoggin: Resolve providing for a state pension for Fred F. Harris of Lewiston. (S. P. 41)

Public Utilities

Mr. Boulter of York: An Act to create York Water District. (S. P. 42)

On motion by Mr. Boulter of York tabled pending reference.

Ways and Bridges

Mr. Littlefield of York: Resolve in favor of the town of Kennebunk. (S. P. 43.)

Sent down for concurrence.

(Emergency Measure)

Resolve, in favor of the Bangor State Hospital. (S. D. 3)

This resolve, carrying the emergency clause, required the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the membership of the Senate on its final passage.

Twenty-eight Senators voting in the affirmative and none opposed, the resolve was given its final passage.
