SENATE

Friday, February 15, 1929.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. N. W. Bryant of Gardiner.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

On motion by Mr. Leland of Piscataquis, out of order and under suspension of the rules, it was

Ordered, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet Tuesday, Feb 19, at four o'clock in the afternoon.

Sent down for concurrence.

Subsequently the foregoing order came back from the House, read and passed in concurrence.

From the House: An act to incorporate the Fish River Power and Storage Company. (S. D. 78)

(In Senate ,January 31, referred to the Committe on Interior Waters.)

In the House, referred to the Committees on Public Utilities, Judiciary and Interior Waters jointly, in non-concurrence.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Mitchell of Aroostook, that body receded from its former action whereby this bill was referred to the Committee on Interior Waters and the bill was referred to the Committee on Public Utilities, Judiciary and Interior Waters jointly, in concurrence.

Banks and Banking

By Mr. Crockett of York: An act to amend chapter 298 of the Public Laws of 1917, relating to licenses of small loan agencies by the Bank Commissioner. (S. P. 440.)

Mr. OAKES of Cumberland: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to present a resolve, under suspension of the rules, after the time limit and I will state that this resolve favors the Children's Heart

Work Society of Maine, one of those institutions that has always received state aid. It is a worthy cause and as I understand, the matter was not sent down here, by oversight in some way and has just come to our attention. It should be taken care of or an injustice will be done.

The request was granted and Mr. Oakes of Cumberland presented Resolve in favor of the Children's Heart Work Society of Maine (S. P. 456); and on motion by that senator the resolve was referred to the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs.

mittee on Pensions, on Resolve in favor of Bangor State Hospital for additional equipment and renovations (S. D. 27) reported the same in a new draft, under the same title (S. P. 455) and that it ought to pass.

The reports were read and accepted and the resolve laid upon the table for printing under the joint rules.

Mr. Weatherbee from the Committee on Public Utilities, on bill an act relating to Portland Gas Light Company (S. D. 101) reported that the same ought to pass.

The report was read and accepted, the bill read once and Tuesday

assigned for second reading.

Mr. Littlefield from the Committee on Sea and Shore Fisheries on bill an act to repeal section 94 of chapter 98, Public Laws of 1921, relating to transportation of lobsters (S. P. 158) reported that the same ought to pass.

The report was read and accepted and the bill laid upon the table for printing under the joint rules.

Mr. Bond from the Committee on Ways and Bridges, on bill an act authorizing the erection of a bridge or roadway across tidewaters between Harbor Island in the town of Phippsburg in the county of Sagadahoc and the mainland of said town (S. D. 42) reported that the same ought to pass.

The report was read and accepted, the bill read once and Tuesday assigned for second reading.
