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HOUSE

Tuesday, February 17, 1931 The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Wood of Augusta.

Journal of the previous session read and approved.

Mr. ALLEN of Sanford: Mr. Speaker, Representative Goodrich of York is in the Hall of the House ready to take upon himself the oath prescribed by the Constitution to enable him to enter upon his official duties.

On motion by Mr. Allen it was voted that a committee of one be appointed to escort the gentleman from York, Mr. Goodrich, to the Governor and Council for the administering of the oath of office.

Thereupon the Speaker appointed the gentleman from Sanford, Mr. Allen, as such committee, who escorted the gentleman from York, Mr. Goodrich, to the executive chamber.

Subsequently the committee returned with the gentleman from York, Mr. Goodrich, and reported that that gentleman had taken the oaths required by the Constitution. Mr. ALLEN: Mr. Speaker, it gives
