SENATE

Tuesday, January 20, 1931.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Carl N. Garland of Augusta.

Journal of Thursday, January 15th, read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

From the House:

An Act to impose an excise tax on motor express companies. (H. P. 12)

In the House, referred to the Committee on Taxation.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Slocum of Cumberland, tabled pending reference.

From the House:

An Act relating to registration of motor vehicles. (S. P. 35)

(In the Senate Jan. 14, referred to Committee on Taxation.)

In the House, referred to the Committee on Judiciary in non-concurrence.

In the Senate, on motion by Mrs. Carter of Androscoggin, that body voted to recede and concur with the House in the reference of the bill.
