Friday, February 27, 1931 Senate called to order by the President.

Orders of the Day

Mr. CROCKETT of York: Mr. President, I should like to inquire if Legislative Document 376, An Act relating to regulation of loans by trust companies, has been returned to the Senate.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair will advise that it is now in the custody of the Senate.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Crockett of York, the rules were suspended and the Senate voted to reconsider its former action whereby this bill was passed to be engrossed. That Senator then offered following the amendment; and moved its adoption:

"Senate Amendment 'A' to S. P. 353, L. D. 376, An act relating to regulation of loans by trust companies. Amend said act by adding thereto the following: Section 2, Section 78, Chapter 57 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the word 'twentyfive' in the twenty-first line of said section and inserting in lieu there-of the word 'fifteen' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

"Section 78. No trust company shall make any loan to any of its directors, officers, agents, or to any other person in its employ, or on which any such director, officer, agent, or employee is an endorser, guarantor, or surety, or to any firm or business syndicate of which such director, officer, agent, or employee is a member or to any person or on the endorsement or guaranty of any person who is a part-ner of, or member of a business syndicate with, such director, ofofficer, agent, or employee or to any corporation of which any such di-rector, officer, agent, or employee is a director, officer, superintendent, or manager, until the proposition to make such loan shall have been submitted by the person desiring the same to the board of directors of such company, or to the execu-tive committee thereof, if any, and accepted and approved by a maj-ority of the entire membership of such board or committee; provided, however, that no director of such company who is interested in said loan in any of the above capacities, or who is connected or associated with the borrower in any of the above ways, shall be regarded as voting the affirmative on such loan. For the purposes of this section each renewal shall be considered as an original loan. Such approval, if the loan is made, shall be spread upon the records of the company; and this record shall, in every instance, give the names of the directors authorizing the loan. Nothing in this section or section seventy-seven shall make it unlawful for a trust company to give any pera trust company to give any per-son, firm, syndicate, or corporation a line of credit to an amount not exceeding fifteen per cent of its total capital, unimpaired surplus and net undivided profits, subject to the several restrictions as to per-centage of artise heard and yight centage of entire board and right of interested persons to vote on same contained in said sections. The records of the company shall show how every director voted on the same, and when such line of credit is given, the treasurer or other authorized officer may pay out loans in accordance therewith without further approval. A line of credit so given shall expire in

six months unless renewed in the same manner in which it is originally given. No loan shall hereafter be made to the treasurer, assistant treasurer, or any employee of the company upon the security of corporation stocks as collateral; provided, however, that this provision shall not apply to the renewal of existing loans."

of existing loans." Mr. CROCKETT: Mr. President, I will say that this simply corrects a technical error and makes Section 78 conform to Section 79 which was previously passed to be engrossed. It changes the word "twenty-five" in this Section to "fifteen" so that it will conform to previous legislation. I now move that it be passed to be engrossed as amended.

Mr. SLOCUM of Cumberland: Mr. President, may I inquire through the Chair if this is an amendment to Legislative Document 376.
