Tuesday, March 3, 1931.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. N. R. Pearson of Oakland.

Journal of Friday, February 27th read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

D. 677), tabled by that Senator on February 20th pending reference; and on further motion by the same Senator the bill was referred to the Committee on Taxation, in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Slocum of Cumberland, the Senate voted take from the table an act relating to regulation of loans by trust companies (L. D. 376), tabled by that Senator on February 27th, pending adoption of Senate Amendment "A"; and on further motion by the same Senator Senate Amendment "A" was adopted and the bill as amended was passed to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. Aldrich of Sagadahoc, the Senate voted to take from the table House Report from the Committee on Taxation, "Ought Not to Pass" on an act relating to taxation of stock of trust and banking companies, (H. P. 135) (L. D. 54) tabled by that Senator February 27th pending acceptance of the report.

Mr. ALDRICH: Mr. President, I now move acceptance of the re-port of the committee "ought not to pass" in concurrence.

Thereupon on motion by Mr. Slo-cum of Cumberland, the bill was laid upon the table pending acceptance of the report.

On motion by Mr. Kitchen of Aroostook, the Senate voted to take from the table, an act changing the charter of the Fort Kent Water Company (S. P. 201) (L. D. 585), tabled by that Senator on February 27th pending passage to be enacted; and on further motion by the same Senator the bill was passed to be enacted.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Foster of Hancock, the Senate voted to take from the table, Emergency Measure, an act to authorize the Treasurer of State under the direction of the Governor and Council to issue bonds for State highway construction and reconstruction for the calendar year 1931 (S. P. 254) (L. D. 269), tabled by that Senator on February 26th pending passage to be enacted; and on further motion by the same Senator the bill was passed to be enacted.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Greenleaf of Androscoggin, the Senate voted to take from the table, an act to extend the rights, powers, and privi-leges of the Sabattus Water and Sewer District (S. P. 521) (L. D. 765), tabled by that Senator on February 27th pending second reading; and on further motion by the same Senator the bill received its second reading and was passed to be engrossed.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Leland of Piscataquis, the Senate voted to take from the table, joint order that "An act relating to Agricultural Societies, H. P. 902, L. D. 385," be returned to the House from the Committee on Agriculture, tabled by that Senator earlier in today's session, pending passage in concurrence; and on further motion by the same Senator the order was passed in concurrence.
