On motion by Mr. Weeks of Somerset, the Senate voted to take from the table, House Report from the Committee on Legal Affairs, "Ought not to pass," on H. P. 836, L. Mr. WEEKS of Somerset: Mr. President, I yield to the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Greenleaf.

Mr. GREENLEAF of Androscoggin: Mr. President, I think there has been a misunderstanding on this bill which I believe has now been ironed out. Will you please advise the present status of the bill.

advise the present status of the bill. The PRESIDENT: The Committee on Legal Affairs, reported on this bill "Ought not to pass." In the House the report was accepted. In the Senate it was voted to recommit the bill to the Committee on Legal Affairs in non-concurrence. The House then voted to adhere to its action in accepting the "Ought not to pass" report. In the Senate the matter was then tabled pending consideration. Mr. GREENLEAF: Mr. President,

Mr. GREENLEAF: Mr. President, I think that the House is now ready to recede and concur with the Senate in the recommitment of this bill to the Committee on Legal Affairs and I therefore move that we insist on our former action and ask for a committee of conference.

The motion prevailed and the Chair appointed as members of such committee on the part of the Senate, the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Greenleaf, the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Southard, and the Senator from Franklin, Senator Holman.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair will announce at this time as members on the part of the Senate of the committee of conference on "An Act to incorporate the Knox Water District," (L. D. 158); on which the Senate voted last Friday to join in the committee of conference: the Senator from Somerset, Senator Weeks, the Senator from York, Senator Boulter, and the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Weymouth.
