### HOUSE

Tuesday, January 24, 1933.

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Jennings of Gardiner.

Journal of the previous session read and approved.

The SPEAKER: The Chair at this time, with a deep feeling of sorrow and grief reports the death of our Sergeant at Arms, H. Ralph Hayes. Last week we had reason to hope that he was improving from his serious illness, but he failed rapidly and died at the Brunswick Hospital last Thursday afternoon.

Hospital last Thursday afternoon. Mr. Hayes had been Messenger of this House since 1925, and previous to that his father had held the same position since 1909. His father, even before that, had been Doorkeeper for many years.

Ralph Hayes was an efficient, courteous and faithful employee, and he will be greatly missed by the many friends he has made during his long service in this House.

Mr. Eastman of Farmingdale presented, out of order, under suspension of the rules, the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

### Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Tompkins of Bridgewater, the House voted to reconsider its action whereby it voted to refer House Paper 103, an act appointing a Commission on Taxa-tion, to the committee on Taxation; and on further motion by the same gentleman the bill was tabled, pending reference to a committee and 500 copies ordered printed.

The SPEAKER: The Chair calls the members' attention at this time to the sheets which were laid on your desks this afternoon showing a new suggested method of printing bills. You will note there what is called the present method at the top of the sheet is done by printing what is called a preamble in which the changes in the bill are set out in full, and then following that the bill as it will read when amended, if printed. Under the new method that has been devised by the printer and the Revisor of the Statutes, as shown at the bottom of the page, any new words inserted in a Statute by an amendment ap-pear in the heavy black face type. Any words stricken out of the old act are shown with a line drawn through them.

It is thought by adopting this method a lot of confusion will be saved, and some expense in print-ing, in that it is hoped that the bills can be printed once and then used right up through the various steps of their enactment without reprinting.

Any suggestions that any of you have on this new method will be welcomed by the Revisor of the Statutes or by the printer.

If there are no other matters under orders of the day the Clerk will read the notices.
