Tuesday, January 17, 1933. Senate called to order by the

Secretary. Prayer by Rev. Stanley Manning

of Augusta.

The Secretary announced the absence of the President and that it was the duty of the Senate to elect a president pro tempore.

Thereupon Mr. Kitchen of Aroostook nominated the Senator from

Somerset, Senator Weeks, as President pro tempore.

On motion by Mr. Kitchen of Aroostook, the Assistant Secretary of the Senate cast the unanimous ballot of the Senate for Mr. Weeks of Somerset as President pro tempore.

The Messenger escorted Mr. Weeks to the chair. (Applause).

On motion by Mr. Holmes of Androscoggin it was voted that the rules be suspended and that the reading of the Journal of yesterday be deferred until the next legislative day.

Mr. HOLMES of Androscoggin: Mr. President, it is with great sorrow that I announce to you and to the Senate the death of our col-

league, Senator William E. Lawless of Androscoggin County.
On motion by Mr. Winn of Androscoggin, it was

Ordered, the House concurring, Ordered, the House concurring, that a Committee consisting of three members on the part of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate pro tempore, with such members as the House may join be appointed to attend the funeral services of Honortend the funeral services of Honorable William E. Lawless, late Senator from Androscoggin. (S. P. 52).

The President pro tempore appointed

Senators Winn of Androscoggin, Kitchen of Aroostook, Cooper of Waldo.

Sent down for concurrence.

Subsequently, the foregoing order came back from the House read and passed in concurrence, the Speaker having joined as members of such committee on the part of the House, Messrs. Scates of West-brook, Farris of Augusta, Breen of Lewiston, Geo. Hamel of Lewiston, Wallingford of Auburn, Napoleon Hamel of Lewiston, Michaud of Van Buren.

Mr. FARNSWORTH of Aroostook: Mr. President, as a further mark of respect to our late Senator Lawless I move that the Senate now adjourn until ten o'clock tomorrow morning.

The motion prevailed.
