I report to you certain deficien-cies, being bills coming into my hands dated several years ago and for which no appropriation is now available to pay the same. These bills amount to \$370.60 and are reported to you by authority of Chap. 2. Sec. 100, R. S. 1930, which reads in part: . . . "Whenever any reads in part: . . . "Whenever any appropriation or fund is expended all bills and accounts presented to the state auditor, (now state con-troller), and drawn on said ex-pended appropriation shall not be approved by him, but shall be re-ported by him to the next session of the legislature."
