To Whom it May Concern:

This is to certify that at the general election of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians, held in accordance with Section 282, Chapter 1 of the laws of Maine, 1933, on the first Tuesday of November 1934, John S. Nelson was duly elected as Representative to the State Legislature for the term of two years, beginning with the first Wednes-day of January, 1935, and ending with the first Tuesday of November, 1936.

Mr. Richardson of South Portland presented the following order and moved its passage:

Ordered the Senate concurring. that the Secretary of State be and hereby is authorized and directed to furnish each member and officer of the Senate and House with one copy of the Maine State Year Book. Mr. TUPPER of Calais: Mr.

Speaker, if I understand rightly this is called the Maine Register, is it not?

Mr. RICHARDSON: It is.

Mr. TUPPER: Mr. Speaker, this book, if I am correct, costs five or six dollars a copy, and it does not seem to me necessary for the State to appropriate money to buy each member the Maine State Register. It would cost approximately a thousand dollars to carry out this order, and I move its indefinite postponement.

A viva voce vote being taken, the motion to indefinitely postpone prevailed.
