HOUSE

Thursday, February 7, 1935.

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Pressey of Augusta.

Journal of the previous session read and approved.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

From the Senate: Bill An act to provide for pensions for veterans of the Civil War, Spanish War and Philippine Insurrection, and their dependents, S. P. 383.

Ordered, that in view of the fact that an appropriation for old age pensions, so-called, may be made by the present Legislature, and that many of the persons now in almshouses would thereby be af-fected, in which event the operation of poor farms, so-called, would be impracticable, a committee of sixteen members, one from each county, shall be chosen from the House of Representatives of the Eighty-Seventh Legislature, now in session, by the Speaker thereof, to investigate the advisability of es-tablishing one county farm in each county, and, if found advisable, to submit recommendations therefor at a later date of the present legislative session.

On motion by Mr. Hill of South Portland the order was tabled pending passage.

On motion by Mr. Ellis of Rangeley, it was voted to take from the table the first unassigned matter, H. P. 448, L. D. 131, bill an act relating to hunting on Sunday, tabled by that gentleman January 24, pending reference; and on further motion by the same gentleman the bill was referred to the committee on Inland Fisheries and Game.

On motion by Mr. Desmond of Portland, the House voted to reconsider its action whereby, earlier this morning, it voted to refer H. P. 1202, bill an act relating to Game Preserves at Back Bay Portland, to the committee on Inland Fisheries and Game; and on further motion by the same gentleman, the bill was tabled pending reference.
