HOUSE

Tuesday, February 12, 1935.

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Cunningham of Augusta.

Journal of the previous session read and approved.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

From the Senate:

An act to permit national forests in Maine (S. P. No. 216) (L. D. 189) which was referred to the Commit-State Lands and Forest tee on Preservation in non-concurrence in

the House on February 6th. Comes from the Senate that body voting to insist on its former action whereby the bill was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, and asking for a Committee of Conference, with following conferees appointed the on its part: Messrs. Friend of Som-erset, Thatcher of Penobscot and Burkett of Cumberland. In the House:

Mr. MACE of Augusta: Mr. Speaker and members of the House of the Eighty-seventh Legislature: I wish to make a little explanation in regard to this bill before making a motion with reference to it. The bill for national parks, intro-duced into the Eighty-sixth Legislature, I was very much interested in. I followed that bill very carefully and I obtained as much information as I could obtain, not only from the archives of this state but from the archives of other states that have passed enabling acts, enabling the United States government to have national parks in other states.

It has been my good fortune in the past to have traveled over the entire forest areas of Maine. I have looked through the glasses from the lookout stations on twentyfive of these stations, looked over its vast expanse of forests with its great lakes and its innumerable I have traveled miles on rivers. foot through those forests in every batteau, power boat and steamer. I have traveled its lakes and rivers from Moosehead Lake clear through to the Canadian border at St. Francis. One trip especially, going light, with a man to guide the canoe and myself carrying the necessary dunnage, we stopped four times, four

nights, on this Allegash trip. T know the forests of Maine.

Now when this question came up in regard to national parks I saw the immense possibilities, the great good, that might ome to the peoble of this State. There was no intended reflection on this great Judiciary committee. I recognize ability, they are personal their friends of mine. I love and respect them, especially the members of this House. I tabled this bill with the idea that the members might study it. I thought possibly the committee on State Lands and Forest Preservation might give the bill full and fair consideration; but it seems, Mr. Speaker and members of the House, that was not to be. I con-sulted the Senate chairman of the committee, House the Judiciary chairman of the Judiciary committee and members of this House on that committee and they were per-fectly willing that the bill should go before the committee on State Lands and Forest Preservation. was the result? Invisible What forces were at work, forces that wished to defeat the bill in this Legislature. They wished that the matter would come up so that these two committees would be divided. On the Judiciary committee there are five members from Cumberland county, two members from Aroos-tcok, one each from Waldo, Penob-scot and York. There are only two counties with immense forests represented there. On the other hand, the committee on State Lands and Forest Preservation has two members from Somerset, two from Cumberland, two from Penobscot, one from Washington, one from Ox-ford, one from Aroostook and one from Kennebec-five counties with grea⁺ areas of cut-over forest lands. That, Mr. Speaker, and members, was the only reason that I had in view. I wish, perhaps, that I might have some voice-that the committee of which I am a member might have some voice in considering that bill; but, Mr. Speaker, I have great respect for the great Judiciary committee. The Chairman of the Senate committee, a former Speaker here, is a man well versed in the a man respected by all relaw. gardless of party affiliation, in this State. Your House chairman was a member of this House two years ago and we all love and respect him. Then there is the gentleman from Falmouth, the two gentlemen

from Aroostook and the gentleman from South Berwick whose name you saw in the paper the other you saw in the paper the other morning. We have great respect for all these people.

Mr. Speaker, I now move that we recede and concur with the Senate.

The motion prevailed, and the House voted to recede and concur with the Senate in the reference of this bill to the committee on Judiciary.
