**SENATE**

Wednesday, January 16, 1935.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. H. F. Milligan of Gardiner.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

The following bills and resolves were received and on recommendation by the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

**Judiciary**

Mr. Burkett of Cumberland presented bill An act to provide for annual audits in Cities, Towns, Plantations and Village Corporations. (S. P. 119)

(500 copies ordered printed).

Sent down for concurrence.

**Pensions**

Mr. Hussey of Kennebec presented resolve providing for a State Pension for Florence L. Doyle of Augusta. (S. P. 120)

The same Senator presented resolve providing for a State Pension for Margaret Ricker of Augusta. (S. P. 121)

Mr. Fernald of Waldo presented resolve providing for a State Pension for Alice A. Mitchell of Belfast. (S. P. 122)

Sent down for concurrence.

**Public Health**

Mr. Hussey of Kennebec presented bill An act relating to the regulation of eating and lodging places. (S. P. 124)

Sent down for concurrence.

Mr. Blaisdell of Hancock presented Memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging the elimination of the taxation of gasoline by the Federal Government. (S. P. 123)

Which was read and adopted.

Sent to the House.

**Orders**

On motion by Mr. McDonald of Washington, it was

Ordered, that the Secretary of State be directed to provide the members of the Senate, Secretary of the Senate and Assistant Secretary of the Senate with suitable distinctive automobile number plates for the years 1935 and 1936.

The costs of said automobile number plates shall each year be borne by the individual members of the Senate, the Secretary of the Senate and the Assistant Secretary of the Senate and shall be issued by the Secretary of State to the Senate members, Secretary of the Senate and Assistant Secretary of the Senate upon condition that they are holders of the regular State automobile number plates.

Further, that the President of the Senate appoint an advisory committee of three members of the Senate to confer with the Secretary of State in the matter of design of said automobile number plates.

Thereupon, the President appointed as members of such committee Mr. McDonald of Washington, Mr. Blaisdell of Hancock and Mr. Schnurle of Cumberland.

On motion by Mr. Hussey of Kennebec, it was

Ordered, the House concurring, that the Joint Rules be amended by adding the following rule, to be numbered 21: "21. Every act, resolve, or order involving the appropriation or expenditure of money shall be presented to the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs for examination and recording before it is engrossed, and no further action shall be had on such acts, resolves, or orders, until proper endorsement thereon is made by said committee."

Sent down for concurrence.
