**SENATE**

Thursday, February 7, 1935.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Carleton H. Fisher of Kingfield.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

On motion by Mr. Blaisdell of Hancock, out of order and under suspension of the rules, it was

ORDERED, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet on Tuesday, February 12th at ten o'clock in the morning. (S. P. 394)

Sent down for concurrence.

Subsequently the foregoing order came back from the House read and passed in concurrence.

Bill An act to permit national forests in Maine. (S. P. 216) (L. D. 189)

(In the Senate on January 29th referred to the Committee on Judiciary.)
