SENATE

Wednesday, February 13, 1935

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. A. N. Bickmore of Augusta.

Journal of yesterday, read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

House Bill in First Reading

An act to provide a Town Council and Manager Form of Government for the Town of Ashland in the County of Aroostook. (H. P. 1196) (L. D. 378)

The following petition and bill were received and on recommendation by the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

Sea and Shore Fisheries

Mr. Worcester of Washington presented "Petition of S. T. Openshaw and 120 others of Jonesport and Beals, in Favor of the Repeal of the Present Closed Season on Lobster Fishing." (S. P. 448)

Sent down for concurrence.

Temperance

Mr. Burkett of Cumberland presented Bill "An Act Regulating the Purchases of Liquor by the State Liquor Commission." (S. P. 449)

(500 copies ordered printed.)

Sent down for concurrence.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair might state at this time that apparently this bill is outside of the rules. However, it was in the possession of the Senate last week and inadvertently was omitted from the advance journal.

Mr. Blaisdell from the Committee on Legal Affairs on Bill An act for use of Temporary number plates. (S. P. 139) (L. D. 55) reported that the same ought to pass.

(On motion by Mr. Fernald of Waldo, the bill and report were laid upon the table pending acceptance of the report.)

An act relating to rules and regulations of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game. (S. P. 133) (L. D. 80)

Resolve regulating fishing in Beaver Pond, the tributaries and outlet thereto. (S. P. 135) (L. D. 429)

Resolve regulating fishing in Silver Lake. (S. P. 147) (L. D. 428)

Resolve regulating fishing in Pleasant Pond tributaries. (S. P. 134) (L. D. 427)

Sent down for concurrence.

An act to authorize the Farm Lands Loan Commission to make certain funds available for the Commissioner of Agriculture. (H. P. 419) (L. D. 112)

An act relating to corporations without capital stock. (H. P. 1110) (L. D. 320)

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Fernald of Waldo, the Senate voted to take from the table, Resolve directing the Governor to proclaim October 11th of each year "General Pulaski's Memorial Day" (S. P. 425), tabled on February 12th by that Senator pending reference; and on further motion by the same Senator the resolve was referred to the Committee on Military Affairs.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Ashby of Aroostook, the Senate voted to take from the table, An act relating to bounties (H. P. 1127) (L. D. 303), tabled on February 7th by that Senator pending reference in concurrence; and on further motion by the same Senator the bill was referred to the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game in concurrence.

On motion by Miss Martin of Penobscot, the Senate voted to take from the table, An act providing for the manufacture of motor vehicle registration plates and other plates for the use of the State at the State Prison (H. P. 1210) (L. D. 458), tabled on February 12th by that Senator pending reference in concurrence; and on further motion by the same Senator the bill was referred to the Committee on State Prison in concurrence.

On motion by Miss Martin of

Penobscot, the Senate voted to take from the table, An act making use of copper metal mandatory in the purchase or production of motor vehicle plates (H. P. 1215) (L. D. 461), tabled on February 12th by that Senator pending reference in concurrence; and on further motion by the same Senator the bill was referred to the Committee on State Prison in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Burns of Aroostook,
