**HOUSE**

Wednesday, January 13, 1937.

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Pressey of Augusta.

Journal of the previous session read and approved.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

From the Senate: Bill an act to establish a section of the boundary line between Windham and Raymond, S. P. No. 36.

Comes from the Senate, referred to the committee on Towns.

In the House, on motion by Mr. Haskell of Windham, indefinitely postponed in non-concurrence.

From the Senate: The following Order:

ORDERED, the House concurring, that no bill or resolve be received by this legislature after four o'clock in the afternoon on Thursday, February 11, 1937, except by unanimous consent in the body in which it is introduced, and further,

ORDERED, that any bill or resolve which shall be received in either body of this legislature by unanimous consent after four o'clock in the afternoon on Thursday, February 11, 1937, shall be referred to the Eighty-ninth Legislature if unanimous consent for its reception is not given in the other body in concurrence. These orders shall not apply to bills reported by any joint standing or joint select committee in the regular course of business, nor to such bills and resolves as are intended only to facilitate the business of the Eighty-eighth Legislature; and be it further

ORDERED, that the Secretary of the Senate cause a copy of the above orders to be published in all the daily and weekly papers of the State, commencing January 13, 1937, and continuing up to and including February 11, 1937. (S. P. No. 13)

Comes from the Senate read and passed.

In the House, read and passed in concurrence.

From the Senate: The following Order:

ORDERED, the House concurring,

that no bill for private or special legislation be received by this Legislature after four o'clock in the afternoon on Thursday, February 4, 1937, except by unanimous consent in the body in which it is introduced, and further that any bill for private or special legislation which shall be received in either body of this legislature by unanimous consent after four o'clock in the afternoon on Thursday, February 4, 1937, shall be referred to the Eighty-ninth Legislature if unanimous consent for its reception is not given in the other body in concurrence, and further that the Secretary of the Senate cause a copy of the above orders to be published in all the daily and weekly papers of the State, commencing January 13, 1937, and continuing up to and including February 4, 1937. (S. P. No. 7)

Comes from the Senate read and passed.

In the House, read and passed in concurrence.

An act creating a Board of Education for the city of Lewiston (H. P. No. 12) (Presented by Mr. Boucher of Lewiston, by request) (1,000 copies ordered printed)

An act relating to town meetings in Bar Harbor (H. P. No. 13) (Presented by Mr. Hodgkins of Bar Harbor) (500 copies ordered printed)
