#### Orders of the Day

The Speaker laid before the House the following Order:

ORDERED, that in view of the fact that an appropriation for "old age pensions," so-called, may be made by the present Legislature and that many of the persons now in almshouses would thereby be affected, in which event, the operation of poor-farms, so-called, would be impracticable, a committee of 16 members, one from each county, shall be chosen from the House of Representatives of the 87th Legislature now in session, by the Speaker thereof, to investigate the advisability of establishing one county farm in each county; and, if found feasible to submit recommendations therefor at a later date of the present legislative session; which was referred to the House of Representatives of this Legislature by the House of the 87th Legislature.
