(H. P. No. 490) (L. D. No. 142) An act relating to the regulation of wires.

(H. P. No. 491) (L. D. No. 143) An act to increase the amount to be paid for clerk hire in the office of the Register of Deeds in the county of Knox.

H. P. No. 492) (L. D. No. 144) An act relating to salary of clerks in office of Register of Deeds in Ox-

Ellis motion by Mr. of Rangeley, it was voted to take from the table the second unassigned matter, joint order relative to reception of bills of a strictly revisory nature, S. P. 186, tabled by that gentleman on February 4th pending passage in concurrence.

Mr. ELLIS: Mr. Speaker, as this

matter has been taken care of by an order passed by both branches, subsequent to this one, I now move that the order be indefinitely postponed in non-concurrence.

The motion prevailed and the order was indefinitely postponed in

non-concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Varney of Berwick, it was voted to take from the table the first unassigned matter, bill an act relating to the State Police Retirement System, H. P. 667, tabled by that gentleman on February 3rd pending reference to a committee; and on further mo-tion by the same gentleman the bill was referred to the committee on Pensions.

On motion by Mr. Russell of Gray, it was voted to take from the table the eleventh unassigned matter, resolve proposing an amendment to the Constitution, relating to the election of the Gov-ernor's Council, H. P. 1429, tabled by that gentleman on February 16th pending reference to a committee; and on further motion by the same gentleman the resolve was referred to the committee on Judiciary, 750 copies ordered printed, and sent up for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Russell of Gray, it was voted to take from the table the twelfth unassigned matter, resolve proposing an amendment to the Constitution, providing for the election of the Governor's Council, H. P. 1430, tabled by gentleman that on February pending reference to committee; and further on motion by the same gentleman the resolve was referred to the committee on Judiciary, 750 copies ordered printed, and sent up for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Hammond of Strong, the House voted to recon-

sider its action of yesterday whereby it passed to be engrossed S. P. 63, L. D. 43, resolve in favor of Harry C. Libby of Portland.

Hammond offered House Amendment A and moved its adoption, as follows:

House Amendment A to S. P. 63, L. D. 43, resolve in favor of Harry C. Libby of Portland.

Amend said resolve by striking out the first four paragraphs there-of, which constitute the preamble of the resolve.

Thereupon, House Amendment A was adopted and the resolve as amended by House Amendment A was passed to be engrossed and sent up for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Ellis of Rangeley, it was voted to take from the table the sixth unassigned matter, joint order relative to duties of clerks of committees, H. P. 1331, tabled by that gentleman on February 11th pending passage.

Mr. TABBUT of Columbia Falls: Mr. Speaker, I ask permission to withdraw this order. The SPEAKER: The gentleman from Columbia Falls, Mr. Tabbut, was granted permission to withdraw the order.

On motion by Mr. Ellis of Range-ley, it was voted to take from the table the sixteenth unassigned matter, bill an act relating to divorce, H. P. 468, L. D. 135, tabled on February 16th pending third reading.

Mr. McGLAUFLIN of Portland: Mr. Speaker, having had opportunity to read the bill, I now withdraw my motion to have the bill read.

The SPEAKER: The bill is now in order for its third reading.

On motion by Mr. Ellis of Rangeley, the bill was given its third reading and was passed to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. Bates of Patten, it was voted to take from the table the fourteenth unassigned matter, bill an act relating to ex-emptions of motor vehicles transporting property for hire, H. P. 1562, tabled by that gentleman on February 16th pending reference to a committee.

Mr. BATES: Mr. Speaker, I now ask permission to withdraw this bill.

The SPEAKER: The Chair un-

derstands that the gentleman from Patten, Mr. Bates, now moves that the House reconsider its action of yesterday whereby 750 copies of this bill were ordered printed.

Bates was granted permission to withdraw the bill.
